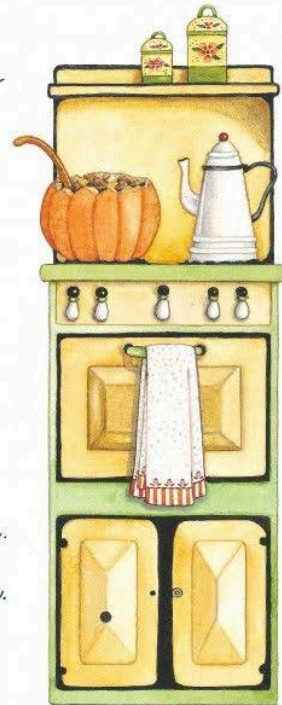


From Country Living's Pantry

PUMPKIN STEW

For a hearty harvest supper, serve this beef-and-pumpkin stew right from the pumpkin shell. ♥

- 1/2 lbs. boneless beef round, cubed
- 1 Tbsp. butter
- 1 med. onion, coarsely chopped
- 2 stalks celery, coarsely chopped
- 5 c. water
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. dried thyme leaves
- 1/4 tsp. ground black pepper
- 1 5-lb. pumpkin
- 1/4 c. sifted all-purpose flour
- 1 c. frozen green peas



In 4-qt. Dutch oven, brown beef in butter. Add onion & celery; sauté until browned. Stir in 4 c. water, the salt, thyme, & pepper. Heat to boiling; cook, covered, 1 hour. Cut 2" off top of pumpkin. Trim rim of pumpkin bottom to form points; scoop out seeds. Peel top & trimmings; cut into 1" cubes; add to beef after 1 hour. Cook 30 min. longer or until tender. Heat oven to 350°. Bake pumpkin shell 20 min. Stir flour into 1 c. water; add to stew with peas. Cook, stirring, until thickened; spoon into shell & serve. ♥

From the Chaplain's Desk

Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise!

Give thanks to him; bless his name! (Psalm 100:4)

What does God think about Thanksgiving? Is he blessed when we give thanks? Of course, he is because giving thanks is a mark of those who know God's character and His position as God. God is the giver of every good gift (James 1:16), and it is our gratitude with which we enter his courts with praise.

God is always at work for our good and for his glory. Biblical thanksgiving does not focus on circumstances but on the goodness of God. Circumstances change constantly; we cannot rely on them. That is why we trust in God who is unchanging, and we should give thanks even for the small things.

Often, we give thanks for the things that make us stop in our tracks and realize God's fingerprints all over them – the big, life-giving or life-changing moments. And many times, we dismiss and forget to be thankful for the seemingly small, ordinary gifts but God wants us to be grateful for every gift. Dietrich Bonhoeffer said, "Only he who gives thanks for little things receives the big things. We pray for the big things and forget to give thanks for the ordinary, small (and yet not small) gifts. How can God entrust great things to one who will not thankfully receive from Him the little things?" (Life Together, 29)

As we celebrate Thanksgiving 2018, may we pause and ponder the small (and yet not small) gifts. It is my prayer that you may be blessed and glorify God as you remember the little moments that made you smile or an unexpected and yet almost undetected moment that, in hindsight, changed your life. May you enter His gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise.
