Christianity first spread into Germany through the work of faithful Christians from the church which the apostle John planted in Smyrna (Rev. 2:11).

Modern Germany was a part of two Roman provinces then, known as Gaul and Germania. The earliest missionaries and believers there suffered terribly at the hands of pagan persecution. Many brave early Christians, like the first pastor in Germany Pothius, his deacon Sanctus, the faithful slave-girl Blandina, and the worthy child Ponticus, gave their lives for their newfound faith. It was after this first outbreak of persecution that a missionary named Irenaeus was sent to become the new pastor, who was himself a disciple of Polycarp, pastor of Smyrna, who was a disciple of the apostle John. That means there are only four degrees of separation between the first Christians in Germany, and the Lord Jesus Himself (not even the Mennonite-game can beat those odds!).

Or again, the faithful missionary Boniface (the St. Boniface who everything in Winnipeg is named after) who brought the German people back to the true faith after they had lived some three hundred years in heresy. Or his faithful helper Agatha (the St. Agath who the town is named after, and who you might even be named after!), a woman of such holiness that God worked many mighty miracles through her. These loyal and righteous ancient Christians gave our ancestors the deposit of holy faith which is ours today. Thank God for their faithfulness!

(If you want to know more about their stories, you can read them in Eusebius: Ecclesiastical History and Wilibald's The Life of Boniface.)

Keeping you informed and up to date with HavenGroup policies that effect you!

Policy: Steinbach Housing Inc. apartments including Fernwood Place and Linden Place, have established house rules which prevent smoking within the confines of their apartment unit, balconies and all shared common spaces. Therefore, smoking, tobacco/cannabis, and the use of electronic cigarettes, shall not be permitted in Steinbach Housing Inc. owned or leased complexes by tenants, employees, visitors and volunteers.

Procedure:

- 1. Smoking of tobacco, cannabis and electronic cigarettes is not permitted within Steinbach Housing Inc. owned/leased apartments complexes and residential properties.
- 2. Steinbach Housing Inc. shall provide designated smoking areas in the designated locations as follows:
 - 2.1 Fernwood Place edge of tenant parking lot (by the Maintenance garage)
 - 2.2 Linden Place sitting area to the east of the tenant parking lot There shall be no smoking within a minimum distance of ten (10) meters of an entranceway or building air intake.
- 3. No person shall smoke cannabis or use an e-cigarette to vaporize an e-substance containing cannabis at an outdoor public place, including Steinbach Housing Inc. designated smoking areas, sidewalks and outdoor parking lots.
