From the Chaplain's Desk

“On the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb while it was still dark. She saw that the stone had been removed...” John 20:1

The apostle John wrote his Gospel to resemble the book of Genesis. He opens with “In the beginning...” and goes on to discuss Jesus’ role in creation. Jesus performs seven signs which correspond to the seven days of creation. On the sixth day in Genesis, God creates humanity in his image; on the sixth day in John, Pilate declares, “Behold, the man!” On the seventh day in Genesis, Saturday, God rests; on the Saturday in John, God incarnate rests in the tomb. And then, very early in the morning, on the first day of a new week (the eighth day, if you like) Mary Magdalene comes to the garden tomb and finds it...empty! And now we’re in new territory, for mere hours later she is face-to-face with the resurrected Jesus himself!

John has done all this careful echoing of Genesis to make one clear point: In Jesus, all of creation is beginning again! He simultaneously affirms all that was good in the old creation (including human beings) and rids it of what was evil (including in human beings). When Jesus is raised from the dead, it’s as if all of history begins again new, clean, and fresh. John presents us with an image of a man (Jesus) a woman (Mary Magdalene) in a garden on the first day of a new week as his way of saying: ‘It’s all becoming new! And so can you!’

In Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection, everything that went wrong with Adam is being set right at last. That can include everything wrong in you and me as well. Praise the Lord!

Policy Posting

Internal Moves Policy

Stay informed with HavenGroup policies as we add them to the newsletter.

Policy:

The intent of this policy is to practice sound fiscal management without causing undue hardship to the tenant. An Internal Move should always be considered a privilege, not a right of the tenant and are therefore, not guaranteed.

Internal Moves are expensive for the organization. The apartment desired by the tenant(s) has to be prepared for occupancy {maintenance costs} and remain vacant {revenue loss} during the period of preparation. The apartment vacated by the tenant also has to be prepared for occupancy and will remain vacant during the preparation. Thus, the Landlord has to bear double maintenance cost plus loss of revenue {possibly for as long as a month, depending upon the extent of repairs required}.


Procedure:

- A request for an Internal Move must be submitted in writing to the Director of Housing, and shall include the reasons for making the request. In ordinary circumstances, a request to move to another unit of the same size as the current one will not be considered unless due to physical need of the tenant(s).
- Current tenants will not have priority over new applicants unless they have change in family circumstances which makes their current apartment unaffordable. The Landlord may request financial disclosure by the tenant(s).
- If two or more tenants are in the same situation and desire the same apartment, priority shall be given to the tenant(s) demonstrating the greatest financial need.
- After an apartment has been assigned, the tenant(s) making the move will be required to make a payment of \$500 to assist with revenue loss of the Landlord.
- Whenever possible, the schedule for an Internal Move will be worked out in such a way that neither apartment remains vacant for more than 15 days.
- In cases of extreme financial hardship, a tenant requesting an Internal Move may write the Chief Executive Officer requesting the deposit be waived.
